The past year has shown the strength and resilience of our community. Normal for Northamptonshire was a mismanaged County Council that went bankrupt and lost millions of our money. Residents across the county have quite literally had to pay the price through steep council tax rises – all whilst services have been slashed.

There is an alternative. We can have a fairer, greener, **healthier** new start. A Green future.

On 6 May 2021, you have the opportunity to vote for 3 councillors who will join the new unitary authorities in North Northamptonshire and West Northamptonshire. Elected Greens will work to build a safe and supportive community, with inclusive and life-long education, affordable and efficient housing, a green and thriving local economy, a cared for and protected natural environment, future-proofed social care, and accessible and clean transport.

COMMUNITY: SAFE AND SUPPORTIVE

- Foster a culture of accountability and transparency in the new unitary authorities
- Encourage employers to pay a
 Real Living Wage to all
 employees; lead the way by
 ensuring that this is the case for
 employees in the new unitary
 authorities and for sub—
 contracted workers
- Allow for meaningful and open consultations with residents; seek to achieve this by establishing citizen assemblies which will bring decision making closer to the people it most affects
- Work cross—party to call on central government to grant a local trial of Universal Basic Income – an unconditional, monthly payment to every legal resident, which will help cover the costs of living and provide our community with the freedom and security to flourish

- Put words into action and ensure that the Climate Strategy Plan for Northamptonshire is implemented, so that our community can have a green future
- Work with police to promote community policing, including Street Watch schemes
- Support #Citadel in Kettering an evidence—based, harm reduction and public health approach to addiction; seek to expand the project across the county
- Provisions in place such as fines for dog fouling

EDUCATION: INCLUSIVE AND LIFE-LONG

- Protect educational spaces across the county
- Support schools in delivering mental health provision and ensure Special Educational Needs services are well—resourced
- Work with employers and education providers to encourage apprenticeship uptake
- Foster relations between
 Northamptonshire's student population and local residents by encouraging volunteering in the community
- Maintain, and where possible, increase funding for the Northamptonshire Adult Learning Service

HOUSING: AFFORDABLE AND EFFICIENT

- Safeguard our green spaces when considering new housing developments
- Provide the necessary oversight to ensure that new developments are genuinely affordable
- Require all new housing to meet the highest standards of energy efficiency
 ideally the Passivhaus standard
 and strive for Net Zero emissions
- Ensure new developments are accessible by active travel and public transport to shops and services

- Call on central government to grant funding for retrofitting homes across the county
- Seek to revitalise abandoned and empty properties into affordable social housing
 - Work to extend the supported living scheme for homeless individuals, so that everyone in our county can have a place to call home accompanied with rehabilitative support where required

LOCAL ECONOMY: GREEN AND THRIVING

- Adapt to the rise in remote working by encouraging the growth of business hubs for employees to work from, which will revitalise our town centres and combat loneliness
- Work with business groups across the county to ensure investment – particularly in the green industries of the future – which will create high quality, high—paid jobs for residents
- Actively support our small businesses and independent traders, including through business rates relief
- Protect our countryside by ensuring that commercial and warehouse units are built in appropriate and strategic areas

NATURAL ENVIRONMENT: CARED FOR AND PROTECTED

- Address flooding by not building on flood plains, taking pre—emptive action to clean out blocked drains and gullies, and implementing natural flood prevention measures
- Tackle fly-tipping across the county through stronger enforcement measures and making sure waste services are accessible
- Unify recycling schemes across the county; re-evaluate unsustainable plans for incinerating waste; call for a trial of a deposit return scheme

- Develop renewable energy solutions including wind and solar power, air source and ground source heat pumps, and community—owned energy schemes
- Boost biodiversity through protecting wild areas, re— wilding schemes, planting more hedgerows and trees, encouraging organic countryside management and discouraging pesticide use

SOCIAL CARE: FUTURE-PROOFED

- Allow the councils to bring adult
 social care services back in house
 reducing the amount paid to third parties and increasing the quality
 of support given to those in need
- Increase funding for adult day centres, allowing for the councils with the help of volunteers to support the adults in our community who need help
- Call for additional funding so that social care in the home can be provided for all people over 65
- Support early years provision, specialist children's support and youth centres with the necessary resources
- Ensure there is a long-term plan in place for the social care budget

TRANSPORT: ACCESSIBLE AND CLEAN

- Favour walking and cycling infrastructure across the county and ensure that temporary active travel measures due to Covid–19 such as widened pavements and cycle lanes become permanent features
- Ensure existing local Low Emission Strategy plans are implemented
- Support School Streets initiatives where feasible; work in all cases to tackle air pollution around schools from idling cars

- Ensure all active travel networks meet government standard LTN1/20
- Work to restore bus subsidies and work with providers to retrofit buses with clean—fuel alternatives
- Develop charging infrastructure for electric vehicles
 - Ensure roads are well—maintained for the safety of all users; provide the necessary scrutiny for all major highway and road infrastructure tenders
